


Self-Portrait Knowledge Organiser



Vocabulary

- Portrait – A picture of a person
- Self-portrait – A picture of yourself
- Observe – Look carefully and notice things
- Symmetry – when something is the same on both sides
- Symmetrical - If a picture or object shows symmetry
- Drawing tool – Something you can use to draw with
- Sketching -Using feather like strokes to 'tickle' the paper
- Tone - The lightness or darkness of a colour
- Shadow - Happens when something is blocking the light
- Blend – Combine two colours together
- Reflect - Think about your work and how successful you were
- Evaluate - Think about what you would do next time
