A church is a sacred place for Christians. The word 'church' can also mean 'a group of Christian people.' Churches contain many objects and features – each of which have a special job. Churches also have many Christian symbols, representing different ideas and beliefs. Most Christians will go to church on a Sunday to worship. In church songs are sung called hymns. The special talk given by the Vicar or Priest is called a sermon, it reminds Christians how to behave and help others.
