Belief in predestination (the belief that Allah has already planned out what will happen).</li> </ul> </li> <li>• As well as the six main beliefs, there are Five Pillars of Islam.               <p><b>Shahadah:</b> Muslims say a declaration of faith.</p> <p><b>Salah:</b> Muslims pray five times a day. Before prayer, they must wash themselves and then face Mecca whilst praying.</p> <p><b>Zakat:</b> Muslims must donate to charities.</p> <p><b>Sawm:</b> Muslims fast for one month during a time called Ramadan.</p> <p><b>Hajj:</b> Muslims have to travel to Mecca once in their lifetime, if they can afford to.</p> </li> </ul>
