Vocabulary

- Still life painting or sculpture of things which do not move or are no longer alive.
- Contrasting colours opposite each other on the colour wheel.
- Composition the way in which different elements of an artwork are combined or arranged.
- Tone the lightness or darkness of a colour.
- Texture different effects to show how something would feel when touched.
- Sketching drawing using feather like strokes to 'tickle' the paper.
- Impressionism paintings that aimed to show the changing of light and capture scenes of life and the natural world.
- Post Impressionism using different shapes and unusual forms to create an unnatural effect and express emotions.
- Oil paint a thick, slow-drying paint that consists of particles of pigment in oil.
- Acrylic paint a thick, fast drying paint that is washable when wet.
- Impasto paint (usually oil) is laid on so thickly that the texture of brush strokes are clearly visible.
- Brush techniques swirls, different directions, contouring, texture, broken lines, tones.
- Contour brush strokes are in the same direction to follow the curves or edges of the shape.
