1909- Construction begins in Belfast, Ireland



April 10th 1912 at 12 noon- RMS Titanic sets sail from Southampton.



April 14th 1912 at 11:40pm – The lookout sees an iceberg dead ahead.



April 15th 1912- 12:00am – Captain Smith gives the order to call for help.



April 15th 1912- 2:05am- The lifeboats are lowered.



April 15th 1912- 8:50am- RMS Carpathia arrives in New York, USA.



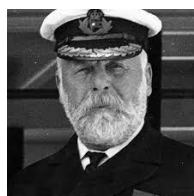
RMS Titanic



RMS Titanic was built by the White Star Line and was the world's largest passenger liner. It measured 882 feet (269m) long and weighed 52, 310 tons.

In 1911 Titanic was declared as practically unsinkable and a marvel of British engineering. The maiden voyage began on the 10th April 1912 in Southampton.

There were over 2000 passengers on board Titanic 600 of them being crew members. 1506 people died on board the Titanic.

Maiden voyage	The first journey a ship makes.

Second Class	Not as luxurious as first class.
Third Class	Very basic facilities and the poorest passengers on board.
Iceberg	A large floating piece of ice from a glacier that floats in the sea.
Hull	The main body of the ship.
Lifeboat	A small boat to use in an emergency whilst at sea.
Survivor	A person who remains alive after an event in which others have died.
Wreck	An object or structure that has been reduced to a ruin.
