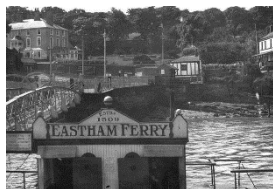

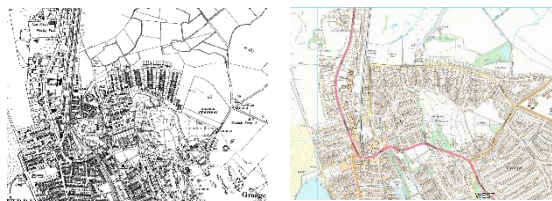
## Local History Hotspots

Wirral	A peninsular in Northwest, England.
Local history	The study of history where you live.

Similarity	Things that have stayed the same over time
Change	Things that have changed over time.
Living memory	A time that can be remembered by people who are still alive.
Beyond living memory	Events that happened a long time ago and cannot be remembered by people living today.
Significant	Something or someone very important
Village	A small settlement usually found in a rural setting.
Timeline	A line that shows dates when events happened.
Port	A docking place for ships on the coast of the ocean, a river or a lake to unload cargo.
Ferry	A boat or ship carrying passengers or goods over a short distance.
