The Shahadah is part of the call to prayer and is said first thing in the morning and last thing at night. It is also whispered in the ear of a new born baby. Muslims believe that the prophet Muhammed was the last and greatest prophet who is revered as the most perfect example of a man, on whom Muslims will model their own lives. Muslims believe that the Angel Jibreel was 'sent down' with God's holy book – the Mother of the Book. This was the book that was shown to Muhammad, so the Qur'an is a copy of God's holy book. The Five Pillars of Islam. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Shahadah: Muslims say a declaration of faith. Salah: Muslims pray five times a day. Before prayer, they must wash themselves and then face Mecca whilst praying. Zakat: Muslims must donate to charities. Sawm: Muslims fast for one month during a time called Ramadan. Hajj: Muslims have to travel to Mecca once in their lifetime, if they can afford to.
