Key Facts

- •In these stories there is often a problem with the food such as it being difficult to make, having too much of it, sometimes it's too hot or cold and sometimes it magically runs away!




- •When we want to make foods such as these, we use a recipe to make sure we get the correct ingredients and cook it correctly.

•This month Muslims end their time of fasting (called Ramadan) and celebrate the festival of Eid.


