

Rivers

- On Wirral Peninsula, the main rivers are the River Mersey and the River Dee.
- A river receives water from a wide area.
- Rivers form on high ground at the source and it changes as it journeys to the sea.
- When a river reaches the sea, it enters the sea via the river mouth.
- There are upper, middle and lower courses of a river and each section its own unique features.

Diagrams

Clouds form when warm. moist air is cooled. When it is cooled, it condenses into tinu water droplets runoff which appear as clouds.



Heat from the sun evaporates water, which rises, condenses in the cool air and then falls back down to earth.

Oceans

An ocean is a large, continuous body of saltwater that covers a significant portion of the Earth's surface. Oceans are the major component of the planet's hydrosphere, and there are five recognised oceans on Earth; Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Antarctic ocean, Arctic Ocean.

Oceans play a crucial role in regulating the Earth's climate, as they absorb and redistribute heat around the globe. They are also home to a vast variety of marine life, influencing weather patterns, and serving as an essential resource for human activities such as transportation, trade, and fisheries.
