How are British Values promoted through Maths at WKPS?

<b>Democracy</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We take into account the views of others and learn about democracy through voting when collecting data to analyse.</li><li>• Democratic process for election of School Council, Eco/Energy monitors, Playground Buddies.</li><li>• Pupil voice questionnaires and interviews to gather opinions.</li></ul>
<b>Rule of Law</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Children follow class rules safely during tasks and activities to benefit everyone, as well as understanding the consequences if rules are ignored.</li></ul>
<b>Individual Liberty</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We work within boundaries to make a safe and personal choice from a given selection during practical activities.</li></ul>
<b>Mutual Respect</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Children behave appropriately, allowing everyone involved the opportunity to work to the best of their ability. Also, they take turns, sharing equipment, reviewing each other's work respectfully and working collaboratively on projects whilst helping others.</li></ul>
<b>Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Whilst carrying out investigations and applying maths to a range of situations, tolerance, patience and resilience are promoted as children are encouraged to persevere, take risks and try different methods.</li><li>• Pupils use Maths to learn about different faiths and cultures around the world. For example, looking at patterns and shapes within Islam and Hindu religions.</li></ul>

***Children will learn that maths comes from a range of different cultures. Celebrating events such as Pi Day and studying Pythagoras helps the children understand that maths originates from different cultures.***
