How are British Values promoted through MFL at WKPS?

Democracy	Learning a new language is a way to foster community and understanding between people of all political persuasions and nationalities. In 'pupil Voice', we interview and question to gather opinions of the children in relation to MFL at WKPS. Outcomes are acted upon, where possible.
Rule of Law	The rule of law, whether they are those that govern the class, school or the countries of the languages we teach is consistently reinforced. Pupils are taught the value and reasons behind different rules and laws in the languages that we are teaching. We discuss responsibilities that are needed to uphold these rules and laws and the consequences when they are broken.
Individual Liberty	Within MFL lessons, pupils are encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a supportive and safe environment. Pupils are encouraged to express their opinions and individual views whilst respecting the views of others.
Mutual Respect	In MFL lessons, we aim to promote the core values of respect, resilience and reflection. Our goal is to increase pupils' knowledge of the importance of mutual respect in school, our local community, nationally and across the world.
Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	The study of MFL encourages an appreciation of different cultures and ways of life. Students will learn about different aspects of foreign cultures such as food, entertainment, music and traditions. Children will realise that the world is made of many people and nations, with its own language. Through engaging with a different culture, pupils will explore the richness of another country's cultural heritage and will be able to compare another culture with their own.
